## Senate Internship Selection Process and Timeline

The 2025 Legislative Session will convene on Tuesday, January 14, 2025.

## **Selection Timeline**

- <u>September-October:</u> Applications are submitted through the Senate Career Website.
  - Final deadline for submission: Friday, November 1, 2024
- <u>November:</u> First round interviews are conducted via Microsoft Teams with the Senate Information Office.
  - All applicants <u>must</u> be interviewed by the Senate Information Office in order to be included in the program.
    - Applications are forwarded to the respective caucus along with recommendations based on interviews.
- <u>December</u>: Second round of interviews are conducted directly with the caucuses and offices over the first three weeks of December.
  - Senators work with their staff to decide who from the first round of interviews they think will be a good fit for their office and will invite the applicant(s) in for an interview. This may take place virtually or in person with Senate staff.
- <u>December 20, 2025</u>: All placement offers will be extended by this date.
  - The Senator's office will contact each person they would like as their intern. If you do not hear from an office, please do not continue to reach out to them.
- December 2024 and January 2025: Mandatory Intern Orientation.
  - Orientation is typically 2 2 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> hours and covers the expectations of the program, legislative procedures, and resources available.
    - Even if you are a returning intern, you are still expected to attend orientation.

## **Important Information**

- Applicants do not need to be a college/university student to be an intern with the Minnesota Senate.
- All applicants must be 18 or older when applying. The Minnesota Senate will not accept applications from anyone under 18 years of age or students still in high school.
- Incomplete applications, or those missing a cover letter <u>and</u> a resume, will not be considered.
- During the interview with Senate Information, applicants are encouraged to share areas of interest and <u>political affiliation</u>. This helps in the recommendation process.
- While internships are arranged with specific offices, interns can expect to work between 8 and 20 hours per week.
- Senate internships are in-person at the Capitol and the Minnesota Senate Building.
